What if life had no visuals? Primary Focus of Art Education



- Teaches how to develop creativity and problem solving skills
- Art helps you look at a problem from several view points

Confidence: Parents can teach Art!

- This program is for anyone committed to our children
- We need to overcome and conceal our own inadequacies about our own art
- As children grow in art (about 4th-6th grade), they may grow so critical of their drawing ability and discouraged that they may lose interest in art – unless encouraged and motivated
- How do we relate to creativity in our own daily lives and impart art's relevancy to children like reading, writing and math instead of saying, "I can't draw?" (Think of your own creative endeavors)




- We are here because we value teaching kids art
- We are our children's art education (K-6)
- We determine whether or not they will draw stick figures for the rest of their lives
- We don't need to teach them "how to draw" but how to perceive better

- Teach kids "I am An Artist" Message
- If you paint, you're a painter
- If you sculpt, you're a sculptor
- If you do art, you're an artist -- through the process of doing
- There are no "mistakes" in art
- Emphasize observations, not judgment "I see you used primary colors in your picture" instead of "that's a great picture"
- Teach kids state-mandated EALR (Essential Academic Learning Requirements)
- Best way is to do this Include an element of art in each visit to the class. Elements include: color, line, shape, texture, pattern, three-dimension, composition, visual awareness, understanding
- Teach kids to have fun and encourage kids to enjoy the process, not the finished product – they'll model your enthusiasm-Practice saying out loud "I am an Artist"

To be a Successful Art Docent Teach with "intention" which implies a goal or purpose
